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WARMER

Write the word give on the whiteboard and ask the students what it means and to give some examples. Elicit different meanings, e.g. transfer ownership, pay, etc.

Put the students in pairs and give them two or three minutes to come up with as many meanings, uses and examples of the word 'give' as they can, using the graphic as an example.

Suggested answers: **phrasal verbs** - give up, give up on, give up to, give yourself up, give in, Give in to, give off, give of, give away, give out, give way, give way to, give back, give over

different meanings - transfer ownership, present/bestow, grant permission, pay, transfer, infect or pass a virus, provide, issue (e.g. a command), perform, sacrifice (e.g. give one's life), cause (e.g. "You're giving me a headache."), collapse/fail (e.g. "The chair gave when I sat in it.")

expressions with give - give and take, give or take, give ground, give chase, give rise to, give someone a hard time, don't/couldn't give a toss (damn/stuff), give someone the cold shoulder, give someone a heads up, What gives?, an Indian giver, give it a rest, give me a break, give someone a hard time

N.B. The above examples are not intended as an exhaustive list, but only cover the vocabulary used in the lesson. It goes without saying that teachers and students will come up with other examples.
